❖ Program Review

Mr. Woloson reviewed the traffic, services and unemployment charts. Yates County continues to have historically low unemployment rates. The Executive Committee meeting on March 6th consisted of a long discussion on the reason for lack of OJT's. Mr. Golumbeck explained the Executive Committee's concern for lack of OJT's even though the funding is available. Steps will be taken to add more OJT's over the upcoming weeks.

❖ One Stop Re-Certification

The 'Continuous Improvement Plan' was developed and approved by the Consortium. This includes two parts; Services at the One Stop Career Centers, and staff development. The workgroup in charge of reporting on this plan will give their final recommendations to the Consortium by May 1st. Mr. Golumbeck made a motion to accept, seconded by Mr. Jordan. All in favor, motion approved.

❖ Demand Occupation

The demand occupation list was reviewed. Mr. Golumbeck noted that the Tourism industry is growing in our region and that may be something to consider for this list. Mr. Jordan inquired about a short-term training program for the upcoming weeks. Mr. O'Hagan discussed the need for results from these training programs after graduation/certification. Mr. Woloson will follow up with these inquiries.

❖ Consortium Update

The Consortium has finished the self assessments for the 'Continuous Improvement Plan'. The staff has been working on making more referrals to services that the One-Stop's provide.

❖ Cluster Update

Mr. Golumbeck discussed FAME. He noted that the session at MCC in the end of January was successful. He also noted that the Pipeline Committee and the Hiring & Training Committee's are meeting in April to talk of how to educate employers about STEM for youth at BOCES. This will also be to help BOCES staff and administration promote Advanced Manufacturing. Mr. Golumbeck mentioned that the H1B Grant has about 100 students enrolled. This grant is for students to attend community colleges in the manufacturing programs. Mr. Woloson noted that the March 20th Healthcare Career Day with the Healthcare Alliance of the Finger Lakes is coming along well. There are about 350 students signed up, from about 16 different school districts. These numbers are up significantly from last year's event.
